Hot Topic - Newton OS 2.0

NEWTON 2.0 WILL SHIP SOON! It is now official, as of 20Oct95, Apple has decided to show off their Newton 2.0 Operating System being heralded as Newton 2.0 at COMDEX in Las Vegas, 13-17Nov95 (Booth #4354, North Hall, Las Vegas Convention Center) as well as Macworld Sydney, Australia, and Apple Expo, UK, the week of 06Nov95.

Newton 2.0 is a major revision of the operating system and is the result of more than two years of extensive customer feedback and user testing. It is designed to advance the Newton platform by providing improved organizational and communications capabilities, as well as the ability to integrate Newton PDAs with Windows and Mac OS-based personal computers and enterprise environments. The Newton 2.0 platform is also designed to provide a more flexible and extensible architecture for a growing number of partners and solutions providers, including independent software vendors (ISVs), systems integrators (SIs), and value-added resellers (VARs).

Newton 2.0 will be available worldwide initially on the Apple MessagePad (MP) 120 beginning in Dec95, and is expected to be available on products from Newton licensees in 1996. Additional technology features that focus on giving customers the capability to connect with their personal computers and enterprise structures will also be available starting in Dec95 and then throughout Q1-Q2'96. The new, more open operating system will be accompanied by more flexible, productive tools for developers using Windows or Mac OS-based personal computers, making it an ideal platform for vertical applications development.

Apple's current distribution strategy for the MP120 includes a mix of channels, including computer, consumer electronics and specialty retail outlets, as well as catalog sales. Consumers will also be able to access information about the Newton platform via the Newton homepage on the WWW: http://www.info.apple.com/newton. Existing MP120 customers will be able to upgrade their systems

beginning in Dec95, with a retail price of \$109. Customers with the earlier MP100 and 110 models will be able to take advantage of a rebate program beginning early next year.

SOME KEY NEWTON 2.0 Q&A

Q: What's new with Newton 2.0? The 6 key improvements in the Newton 2.0 platform are:

- Improved ease of use with a broad range of input options, including significantly improved handwriting recognizer for printed text, support for ink text, and the new external Newton keyboard
- More intuitive, flexible and integrated built-in personal information management applications
- A consolidated universal in and out box with fax send and receive and a built-in email client with internet access
- Third-party solutions for information organization as well as communications applications for both LANs and WANs.
- New solutions for integration with both Windows and Mac OS-based personal computers and enterprise environments
- A flexible, more productive development environment for developers using Windows or Mac OS-based personal computers

Q: Will existing third-party applications work with Newton 2.0?

The next generation Newton 2.0 operating system, based on customer and developer feedback, is a major advancement in PDA development. As with the previous versions of the Newton operating system, we expect that many new applications will be available for Newton 2.0 beginning in December.

As with any major update of an operating system we do expect some incompatibilities with older software applications. There are a number of resources, such as a Newton Solutions Guide and a list of compatible third party products that will be available to customers to determine which software will run optimally on your Newton 2.0 device. These resources will be available via on-line services, Apple's Newton homepage on the worldwide web, the Apple Fax back program and

Be Careful With MP100 and Compaq PC Card

Several readers requested that I let folks know that the MP100 and the \$29 Compaq PC Card Modem are not very friendly. The main reason is that the MP100 doesn't have the internal RAM necessary to handle the PC Card and run communications or email applications. Also be warned that the AAA batteries are not capable of powering the MP100 and the PC Card (the PC Card will work with the AC adapter attached). Sorry for any confusion the article from last week may have caused.

Total Newtons Sold?

There has been several numbers game being played out on the Internet and in some of the print magazines. The following is from stats NewtNews has collected over the last year about Apple Newton sales: 50,000 in 1993 78,000 in 1994 65,000 in 1995 This is 193,000 total. Pen Computing (June/July 1995) reported 200,000 and includes Newtons from Motorola and Sharp. But BIS Strategic Decisions has stated that Apple has only sold 110,000 Newton since launch date and this number does include Motorola and Sharp Newtons. Unfortunately, neither Apple, Motorola, or Sharp have officially released any sales information so we may never really know.

Oracle and Apple?

It appears that Oracle and Apple are very close to signing a joint venture (US\$20 million range) to develop and market Newton based PDA solutions leveraging Oracle's database technology. Both PCWeek and MacWEEK had articles about the possible joint venture in regards to creating Newton based solutions using \$500 device called the "Network Computer." Expect some sort of announcement during COMDEX and an actual product in early 1996.

Latest Net Rumors

Here is a summary of rumors that popped up on USENET News and in the NewtNews email box:

- the MP120 with Newton 2.0 will ship with a Newton Backup Utility that will allow users to keep their data safe by backups to desktop machines and allow for downloading of Newton packages. Upgraded MP120s should also get this software.
- the MP120 with Newton 2.0 is also going to ship with cables to connection your Mac or PC to your Newton. Upgraded MP120s may not get the cable.
- the Apple Keyboard for the Newton is about the size of a Duo keyboard and will retail for \$99.
- Apple has a new NewtonScript framework in the works to make doing Newton development easier.
- Routing of information could be one of the big new features to have the most impact on new innovative Newton solutions.
- The Oracle and Apple joint venture could be very big and far reaching.
- Newton 2.0 ROMs are in short supply. So short that many

important Newton evangelists do not yet have a seed unit, and multiple developer shops have to share their Dante units

Press Release Forced by MacWorld

The rumor is that Apple was forced to released the Newton 2.0 press released on Friday, 20Oct95 because of the Newton insert that is in the December 1995 edition of MacWorld. Apparently the 'Newton World' insert wasn't suppose to be out until sometime in early Nov95. Oh, well, maybe this might speed delivery to consumers -- Dec95 is a long time to wait.

A Most Interesting Rumor

Direct from people who claim to be in the loop. It appears that the Newton may have actually gained some major ground in the recent Apple Board of Directors battles. The Newton is not only safe from being sold out to another party, but may have a new initiative to further craft the Newton OS with the Mac OS. So, you could see in the not so distant future, a Newton interface running on your Mac.

Status of Tabula Rasa?

Tabula Rasa by Brand X Software, a very much hyped forms and data entry software program, has really dropped out of sight. Beta testers report that new versions are not being sent out, and email to several Brand X developers have gone unanswered. Some folks in the know report that management at Brand X has decided that continued development of Tabula Rasa is not a good business opportunity, but the team developing Tabula Rasa want to take the technology and try to become an independent unit.

MP120/1MB Discontinued

According to several people who have visited their local Newton dealers, it does appear that Apple has discontinued the MP120/1MB. It should also be noted that at MacWorld, Apple and Newton Source were really pricing the MP120/1MB to sellout, which it did. Considering how important internal storage is, this isn't too big of a surprise. And with NOS 2.0 on the horizon, NewtNews thinks that you will probably only really want at least a 120/2MB. Mobile Messaging Continues To Get Apple Support

Paging: Gets Two-Way Power

Soon you will be able to send messages back and forth between pagers and PDAs. At the moment you can only use service from SkyTel but expect major competition in the near future. By this time next year there will be over 10 carriers offering a wide range of services with subscribers growing by 20% annually with paging stock going up over 80% in the past 15 months. This past year the pager market was only worth \$2.2 billion but MobileMedia recently announced it was going to spend \$1 billion for BellSouth's paging group. Some of the 'extra' future services include: retrieving and sending email, and wireless

"answering machines." Reportedly HP and Apple will be some of the first computer companies providing services using two-way paging. [Information from The Wall Street Journal, 09/19/95 "Lowly Beeper May Finally Get Respect As Two-Way Paging Services Emerge" by Gautam Naik]

Motorola's Wireless Data and ARDIS have announced limited-time price promotions which offer resellers and end-users Envoy and Marco Wireless Communicators at a reduced cost for the holidays. [iNews]

Accurate Handwriting Recognition

Synaptics (408.434.0110) reports that their HR 1200 Handwriting Recognizer based on neural networking technology is six times more accurate than other solutions. This software is going to be offered on some Norand's PenKey systems. [PC Week, Mark Moore, page 41]

Omnigo PDA from Hewlett Packard

HP (800.443.1254) has announced the OmniGo 100 a \$439 GEOS OS based PDA that supports both pen and keyboard input via Palm Computing's Graffiti. It should ship sometime in November 1995. [PC Week, 16Oct95, Mark Moore, page 39]

A few more interesting items about HP's OmniGo PDA: fits in your shirt pocket, weighs 12 ounces, runs on two AA batteries for more than a week, uses Graffiti for pen input, if you are a geek you can synchronize with your PC PIM application, and sells for \$350. But the bad thing is that it is not integrated with a desktop system. [InfoWorld, 23Oct95, page 122]
