Newton OS 2.0 Takes Top Honors at COMDEX '95!

The Newton 2.0 operating system has received "Best of COMDEX" honors at the recent Comdex/Fall '95 trade show held in Las Vegas, Nevada. Newton 2.0, the operating system for Apple's MessagePad PDA as well as devices from Newton licensees, won "Best of COMDEX" in the "Operating System" category. The coveted "Best of COMDEX" awards, presented annually by Byte Magazine, recognize unique, technically innovative and cutting-edge new computer products at COMDEX, the largest computer tradeshow in the United States.

"This prestigious award is a testament to the great strides we've made in providing a PDA platform which offers customers enhanced personal computer integration, communications and organization capabilities," said Steve Andler, senior director of Mobile Products for Apple Computer. "The enormous support from developers, licensees, and system integrators, combined with the new functionality of the operating system, makes Newton 2.0 among the most compelling PDA platforms on the market today for mobile professionals and vertical markets alike."

"Newton 2.0 marks what could become the turning point for the platform," said Kimball Brown, vice president, Mobile Computing, Dataquest. "The new capabilities in Newton 2.0 are vastly improved over the previous version, providing new ways for developers to add functionality for customers."

More Newton 2.0 at Comdex

Apple's Newton exhibit had over 35 vendors demoing their stuff, as well as a hands-on-area. The general buzz on 2.0 was extremely positive with unanimous agreement that: the recognition was far superior to 1.3 (in print and cursive mode), speed was greatly improved, landscape orientation was great, and the applications that were displayed were fantastic. The traffic through this booth was extremely strong and while most vendors started to see a slow down by 4 PM, the Newton area remained full even past the 5 PM closing each day.

Apple's main exhibit also included a Newton theater where demonstrations and walk-throughs were given. This was by far the busiest section of Apple's booth. Two MP120's with 2.0 were raffled

off there each day.

On Tuesday night the Newton System Group (NSG) threw a party at The Beach for the Newton developers and press. A MP120 w/2.0 was raffled off every hour and there were plenty of units for everyone to try out. It turns out that The Beach is a pretty popular place to party because before the evening was over Newton folks spotted Bill Gates and Ray Charles on the dance floor with them.

Wednesday afternoon the Newton 2.0 operating system received an incredible award: "BEST OF SHOW -- New Operating System" from Byte Magazine. You can check out all the awards at: <http://www.byte.com/bestof.htm>.

- First spotted on AOL, the Newton Backup Utility has been released for download from online services and Internet FTP sites
- ClubMac has been telling folks they have MP120s with Newton 2.0 in stock
- Most people who have ordered MP120s with Newton 2.0 have already gotten their keyboards but no MP120
- The product number for the MP120 with Newton 2.0 is said to be: H0153LL/A

Official Stuff From Apple

The Newton 2.0 will be available on 01Dec95 on the MessagePad (MP) 120 at a suggested retail price of US\$699.

The Newton Backup Utility (NBU) will be bundled with the MP120. It will allow Newton users to back-up and install software on their Newton from Windows or Mac OS systems. NBU for the Mac OS will ship on 01Dec95, and NBU for Windows will be available in Jan96.

Newton Press provides users with a convenient drag-and-drop method for publishing electronic documents, or "books." Newton Press for the Mac OS will be available in Dec95 for US\$69. The Windows based version of Newton Press will be available in Q1,96 and also retail for US\$69.

The Newton Keyboard is an external keyboard that connects to a Newton 2.0 PDA and allows users to easily and quickly type information into a Newton PDA. It will be available Dec95 and will retail for US\$89.

Newton Connection Utilities (NCU) provide users with the ability to integrate data between a Newton PDA and a Windows or MacOS system. These utilities offer the same backup, restore, and installation features of NBU, with the additional ability to allow users to synchronize PC files with corresponding data residing on a Newton PDA. For example, a list of contacts on a PC can be synchronized with the Names file on a Newton PDA so that users always have current and complete information. With NCU, users can also import and export text files and information between a PC and Newton PDA. And by using a modem, users can perform these tasks remotely. With NCU, users can

enter data directly into a Newton PDA via their PC keyboard. NCU is expected to be released in Q1,96 for Windows and Mac OS systems and retail for US\$69

Newton Toolkit 1.6 for Mac OS systems should be available 31Dec95, and priced at US\$299.

Newton Toolkit 1.6 for Windows systems -- Beta Version -- should be available in Q1,96.

The Desktop Integration Libraries (DILs) makes it easy for developers to create customer solutions that allow for direct synchronization of data between applications on Mac OS and Windows systems and Newton PDAs. The Desktop Integration Libraries (DILs) are C libraries which make it possible for data in PC applications to be synchronized with data on Newton PDAs in one easy step. This software should be available Q1,96 and will be bundled with NTK 1.6.

Landscape Pixel and Font Info

John Schettino <js12@gte.com> posted (via USENET newsgroup comp.sys.newton.misc) the following information about Newton 2.0 Landscape mode on a MP120. The size of the screen is 320 by 200 pixels in the current portrait view, and will be 200 by 320 in landscape view. You should be able to get 20 characters down and 50 characters across at 9 point, and 24 characters by 60 characters using a 6 point font.

Punctuation...

David Fedor <fedor@zoom.com> reports on USENET newsgroup comp.sys.newton.misc that as you are doing handwriting recognition input in Newton 2.0 you get a caret just below the area you are writing in to mark your place. If you tap on the caret you will get a pop-up menu to insert "standard" punctuation marks along with backspace, return and space.

Apple Answers on AOL

Dan Glickman, Newton Product Marketing Manager provides the following info on the AOL messageboards:

- Newton 2.0 is faster because of improvements in the NewtonScript interpreter and in how data is stored in Soups
- The recommend external RAM size is still 4MBs but cards up to 20MBs do work in Newtons with varied performance and memory usage
- You can download Newton Backup Utilities (NBU) for MacOS from the AOL software forum or from the official Newton WEB page at http://www.info.apple.com/newton/solutions
- Windows NBU will be available by the end of December.
- The new printed recognizer in Newton 2.0 does NOT learn handwriting as you go. Since it's character based and you don't connect your letters the recognition does not need to 'learn as it goes'. The improved cursive recognizer does learn and has more words in the dictionary 30,000.
- To upgrade you MP 120 to Newton 2.0 call 800-SOS-APPL beginning Dec 1. The cost is \$109. You will also receive Newton Backup Utility and new version of Pocket Quicken.

Newton Tidbits

Newton 2.0 at Apple Expo in London

Phil Moss <P.N.MOSS@livjm.ac.uk> reports that Apple really put on a show for Newton 2.0 at the Apple Expo held in London last week. He was "very impressed" and was able to report the following info on Apples upgrade program for UK MP owners:

> MP120 to MP120 w/2.0 UK\$ 79 MP110 to MP120 w/2.0 UK\$ 260 MP100 to MP120 w/2.0 UK\$ 300 OMP to MP120 w/2.0 UK\$ 360

"These prices include postage and packing, but not VAT. And require you to give up your current Newton for the upgrade."

Eudora Light for Newton 2.0

Probably the most frustrating thing with Eudora Light 1.0 for the current Newton OS 1.3 is that it isn't very well integrated with other applications. In Eudora Light 2.0 (not released yet) you can send email from any application that supports sending email. This new functionality is primarily a product of Newton 2.0, which has made integrating email capabilities to applications much easier.

Memory in Newton 2.0

The following is an attempt to answer questions regarding what Newton 2.0 does to the amount of Heap available:

Apple: "Things at the OS level are more efficient, and Apple will continue to work with developers to make sure their applications are *more efficient as well.*"

Newton Developers: "The heap memory situation has only changed marginally. In theory, the built-in apps are supposed to use heap better, and give it up when they are closed, and this is at least somewhat true. Some apps, like the Extras Drawer, use much more heap than they used to but they do seem to give it up when they close. My app takes up more heap in Newton 2.0 but releasing the heap is easier in Newton 2.0."

"The overall heap numbers haven't changed, and my 2.0 unit seems to have about the same, or slightly less, heap than my 110 in most situations. So the bottom line is -- Yes, you will still need to reset your Newton."

"The system in general seems to be better at managing heap, in that it doesn't disappear quite as quickly, and installed packages don't all sit in the heap (they're in a soup). The Notepad is still pretty bad, especially if you have a big note being displayed. The Notepad never really closes so you have to realize this."

Newton 2.0 Kudos

Plans Announced for New Versions of TransForm

Under the direction of Dr. Jeffrey Schlimmer, members of Washington State University's Team Oriented Software Practicum have announce plans for new versions of transForm, a freely distributed forms package which allows the user to design and utilize his/her own forms on the Newton. The next release of transForm will fix its presently known defects. Following this release, future versions will implement five new features, which were determined by a recent user survey. These features include:

- More than 10 items in field choice lists
- More than one screen per form
- Calculation field
- Summary field for all entries
- Static text

In addition, future versions will also contain:

- Support of Newton 2.0
- Multi-platform data transfer utility

This latter feature is especially important because Momentum's ScriptLink product is no longer available. TransForm's developers are

Newton is Part of SET's Plans

Apple has agreed to license its Newton technology to Schlumberger Electronic Transactions (SET), of Montrouge, France. SET is a division of Schlumberger Ltd -- an international organization with oil field services, and measurement and systems plans to use businesses. SET Newton technology in integrated "smart card" systems, which are designed to automate medical transactions.

Digital Ocean Also Gets an Agreement

Apple and Digital Ocean have reached an agreement for Digital Ocean to license Apple's

Newton technology and customize it for use in vertical applications for companies like Monsanto Company and Harris Corporation. Digital Ocean will market these PDAs to business customers who need innovative, integrated features in a rugged, backlit Newton product. Communication options offered by Digital Ocean include GPS (Global Positioning System), differential GPS (dGPS), wireless LAN, CDPD (Cellular Digital Packet Data), voice-over wireless LAN, and bar coding.

Newton Being used in Field Testing

ABT Water Treatment in Beloit WI is in final beta testing of a Newton solution that reads water meters. The Newton has an interface to a Sensus SmartGun that can read specially equipped meters (in this case water, but could be gas or electric also). The data is being read into a Flash-Data Newton application and then uploaded to an Omnis database system. This specific solution reportedly is half the cost of other metering industry solutions currently on the market. According to the system integrators, while the price is a big deal, the extra functionality built-in to the Newton like email, make it an even better solution then some of the more customized data collection devices. This is a huge market -- why? -- the metering device used in this area has an nationwide installed base of 17 million, and all utility metering devices in the future will have the same "scanning" comms built-in to them.

Mini-Review: KeyMan

Jerry J. McMurry <mcmurry@manta.nosc.mil> writes: "People, I have run across a really terrific piece of shareware for the Newton. It is called Keyman. It has a surprising bunch of added features for the typewriter keypad that you get when you tap the keyboard button (fourth button to the right of the clock button at the bottom). It adds Mac-type cut, copy and paste to the keyboard and a few other features. The important thing I wanted it for was the feature that allows you to have a small calculator available. I have in the past had some data in the Notepad that I wanted to do some addition and division on. With the stock calculator open, the screen is so covered that you can't see the notes, so you would have to write the numbers on (gasp!) *PAPER!!!* to be able to use it. The stock calculator is cute with its little sound effects, but after 5 minutes it gets boring. Keyman's calculator keyboard solves this problem. Keyman is \$15 and you can get it downloaded to you from Ben Gottlieb at <info@standalone.com>."

Three Notable Newton Mentions

Steve Homer has an article in the Mobile Communications section of the The Independent - London called "Pocket systems herald a change" published on 20Nov95. The article focuses on how mobile computing is changing because the devices that transmit and receive data are getting better and better. One example is the Apple Newton

> MessagePad using a PC Card GSM mobile phone. There is a magazine company using this set-up to track sales of their titles in shops. The employee walks into the store, examines the magazine rack, enters in the data, transmits the data, and then goes to the next store. The other big bonuses for using a Newton also includes: plug-and-play communications, much improved handwriting recognition, and the ability to use a keyboard in new MessagePad models. The article also has write-ups about the ZR5000 from Sharp, and the Psion.

Paul Quigley also has an article in the same section of the same edition called "Roaming

with GSM becomes the benchmark." This article looks at the history and the current state of "GSM (Global System for Mobile Communications), the pan-European digital cellular telephone standard." There is expected by the year 2000 to be over 80 million users of GSM in Europe. The key to getting things to work right is getting the right PC Card to work with your PDA (Apple, HP, and Psion seem to have the best). There is also now 'GSM Plus' which will also act as a 14.4-Mbps land-line modem, and GSM is also starting to be able to utilize private mobile radio (PMR) and public access mobile radio (PAMR).

Jon Hulak has a huge article called "In defense of the personal digital assistant" in the 01Oct95 issue of Business Communications Review. This article also has an attached related article called "Categorizing Personal Computing Devices." The article main focus is on: the past history of the PDA and wireless communications; indentifying the key areas PDAs need to excel in, and a look at current offerings with a dabbling of future outlook. This is highly recommended reading if you can get access to the complete article.

Lotus Notes and the Newton

Steven Sims <steve@dreamsft.demon.co.uk> reports the following on the USENET newsgroup comp.sys.newton misc: "TeamAgent (formerly InterAgent) from Ives & Co (Huntingdon, England) will exchange databases to and from Notes and Newton. In fact it'll do any combination of Notes, Newton, ODBC, SQL, Oracle, MS-Access, MS-FoxPro and text. When you're using the Newton driver it works via either serial or modem. Currently TeamAgent is in beta testing, which is expected to be completed soon. Server platforms supported are currently Windows 3.11, 95, NT, and OS/2. There's also a Newton 2.0 optimized version. We're using TeamAgent here at DreamSoft as part of a sales-force automation system, and have had no problems with it at all. It's radically reduced our development time for communications and desktop integration, so we're naturally quite happy with it. We're using it under Win95, and connecting the Newton using a GSM mobile phone. Pricing is expected to be about \$150 for the personal edition of TeamAgent. Rumor Mill

Bad News??

John Markoff had an article in the 12Nov95 edition of the New Your Times News Service that focuses on a recent rumor that Apple may abandon the Newton. The main thrust of the story centers around Michael Spindler being "absolutely adamant about not continuing to pour money into Newton." No 'new' real information has popped up in the ensuing weeks following this article. In a different light, several reports have come in from folks saying that the Newton Systems Group was able to get some 'extra' time at COMDEX to highlight all the strengths of the Newton to upper management. The biggest bonus though might be all the wonderful press the Newton has gotten from the Newton 2.0 release and the visibility at COMDEX.

Marco and Newton 2.0

Details are currently sketchy about what Motorola is planning to offer to the current crop of Macro owners in regards to Newton 2.0, but those in the know say that both Apple and Motorola are working hard at integrating the wireless capabilities of the Marco with Newton 2.0. There could be a new Macro device sometime in early Q1,96. Upgrading the current crop of Macros is suppose to be technically difficult because of hardware design, but not impossible. The bottom line will of course be cost.

Oracle, NetSurfer, and the Newton

The truly plugged-in NewtNews reader probably recognized the pattern of pseudo-related Oracle and Newton rumors, and the previous mention of Acorn's NetSurfer. Several folks in the know from both sides of the Atlantic filled in the gaps to this interesting possibility:

- The Newton and the NetSurfer both use the same ARM processor technology
- Oracle wants to make a inexpensive WWW set-top box
- It is no secret that Larry Ellison, CEO at Oracle, likes Apple, Macintoshes, and the Newton
- A WWW set-top box should have a core, marketable, well-known, underlining OS and come from an identifiable home-market company

With all this, the fusion of Oracle, Apple, Newton, ARM, and NetSurfer make for a potentially market-dominating product.

What is up With MP150??

Questions are constantly being asked about the not yet announced or officially recognized MessagePad 150. Here is a summary of what NewtNews has heard about the MP150:

- Should be available sometime in Q1,96
- Codename 'Q'
- Will use basically the same internal design and processor as the MP 120
- Hardware support for sound input
- Is "palm-sized", which is about the size of the MP120 screen area with similar depth
- Built-in modem
- · Support two Type II PC Cards or one Type III PC Card
- Optional backlighting

Cost will be similar to what the MP120 is currently selling for, with the MP120 dropping into the \$400 range.

Beyond the MP150...

As if the above wasn't stretching it, here is some more rumors on what is planned for the future:

- · Gray scale Newton
- Will use the next generation ARM RISC chip
- Slate sized Newton from Apple and Panasonic
- A Newton that has a pager size screen and form factor
- ATG's Don Norman is recently quoted as saying "Bookstores won't have to stock physical books any more. A backlit electronic book reader is coming."
- Will ship with the ability to transport you anywhere you desire on the command "Scotty, beam me up."

Digital ARM Information
